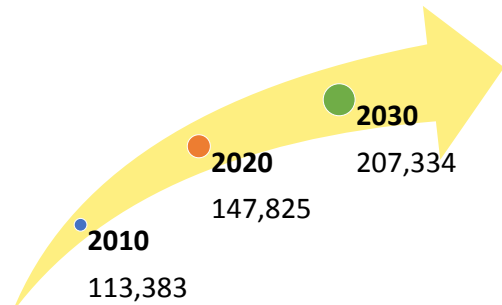

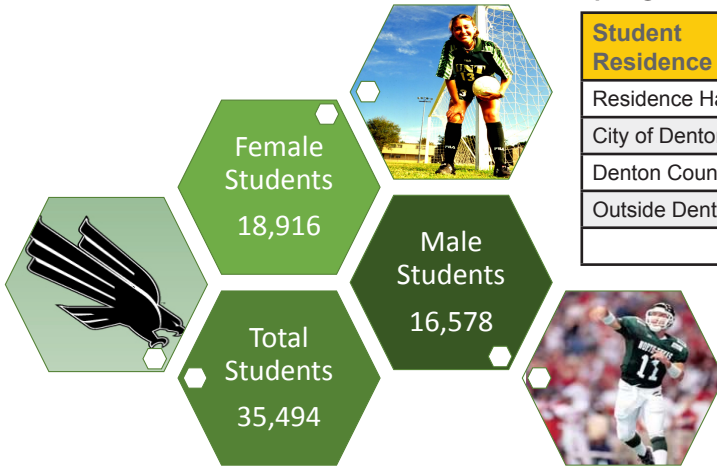

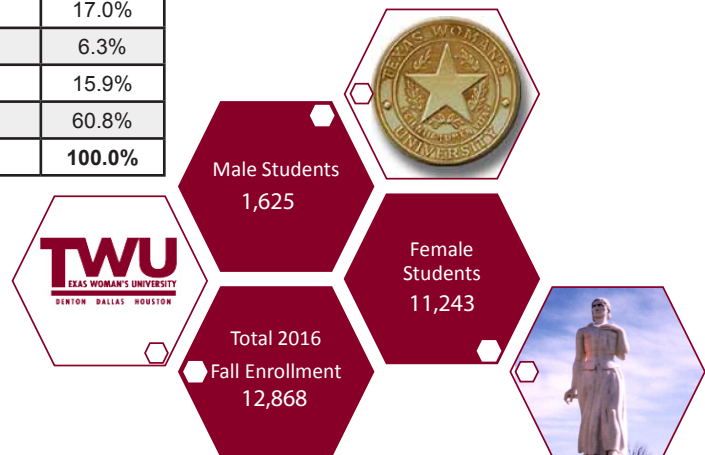

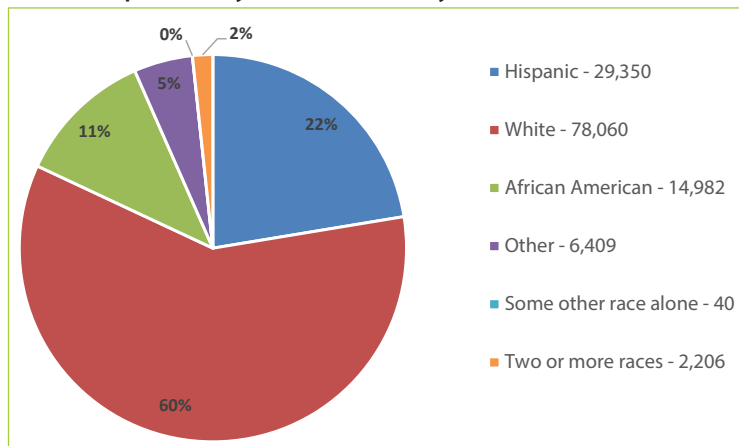

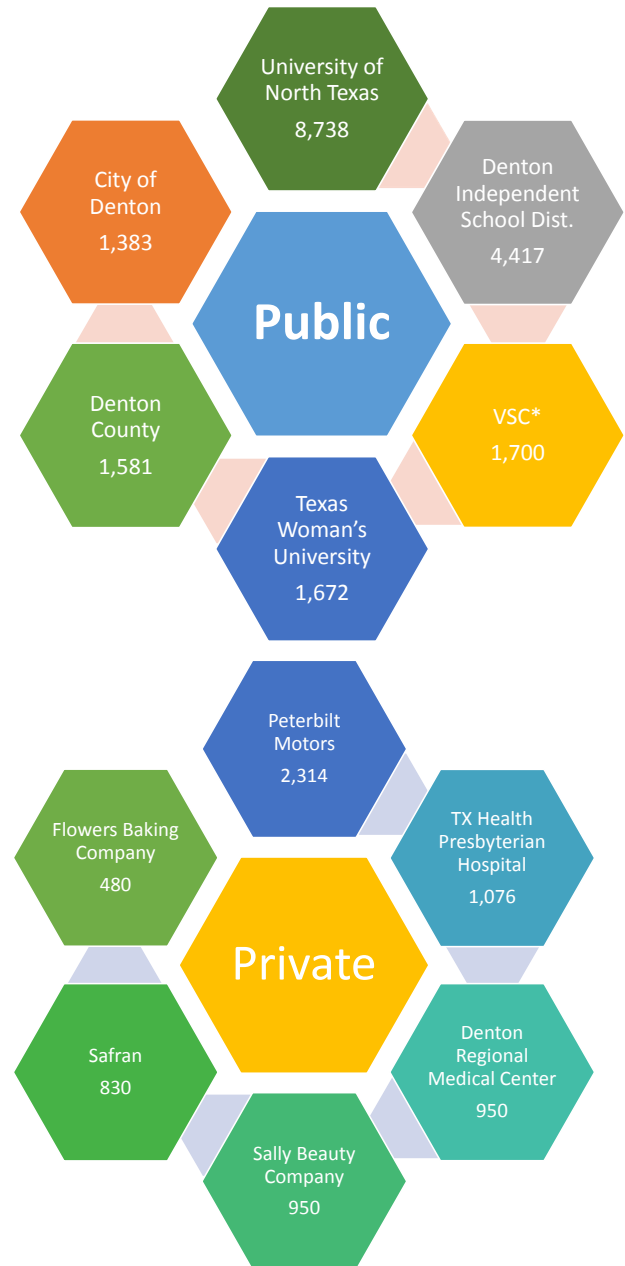

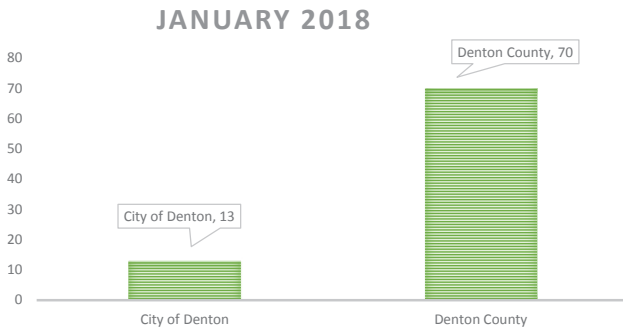

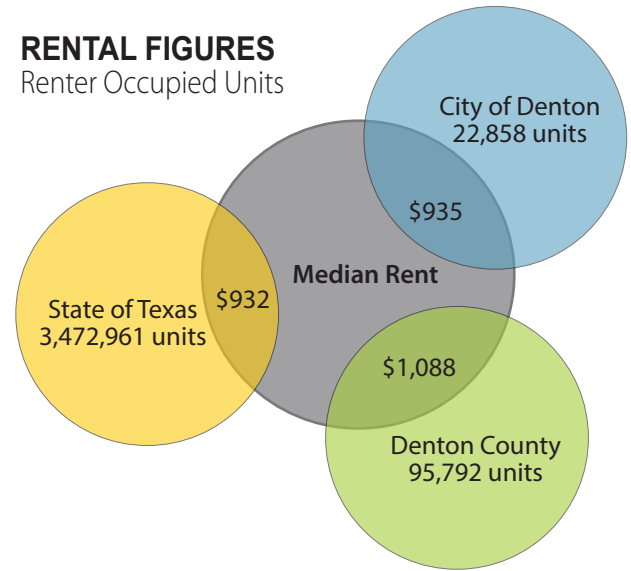
Foreclosures

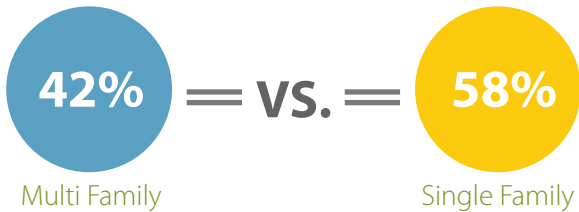

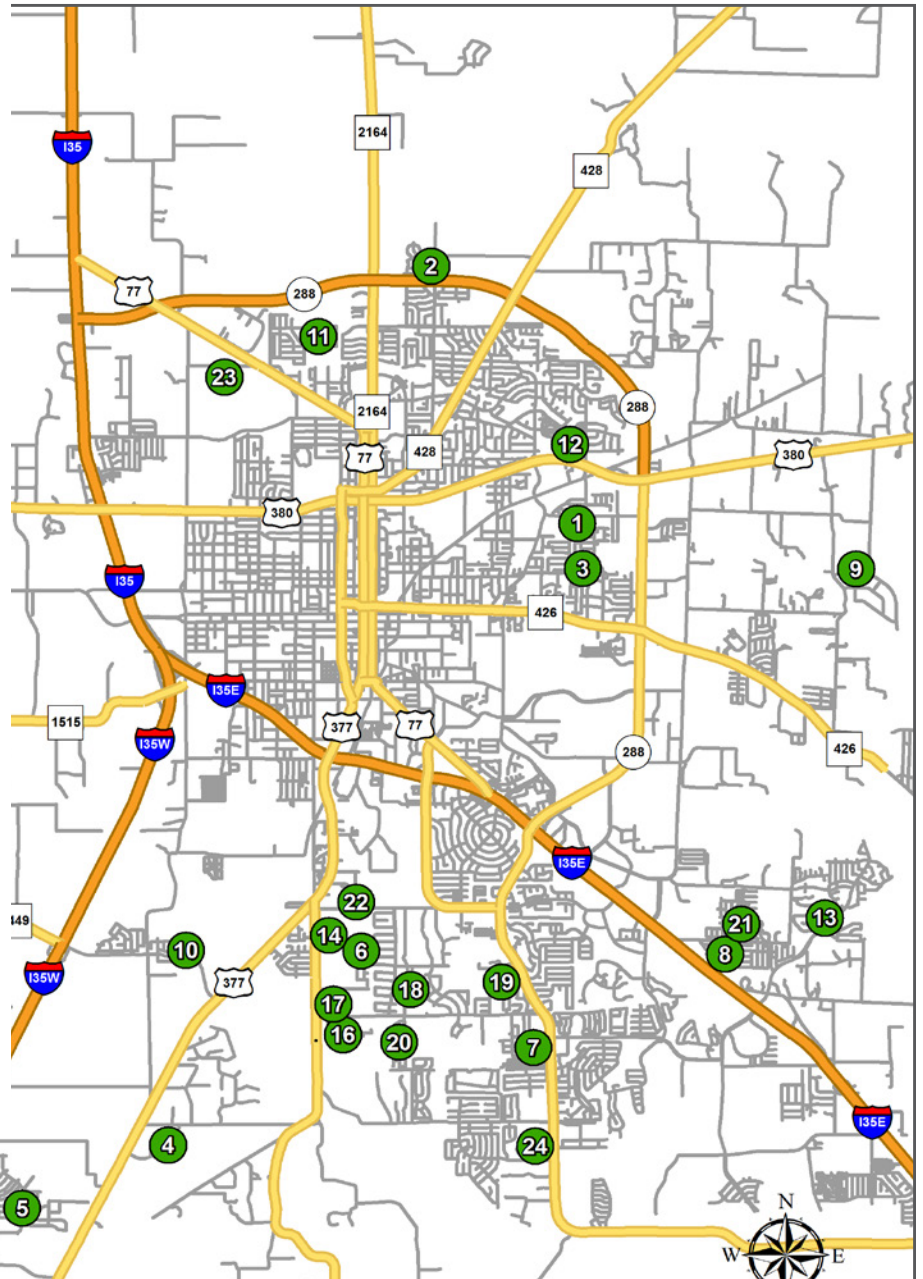

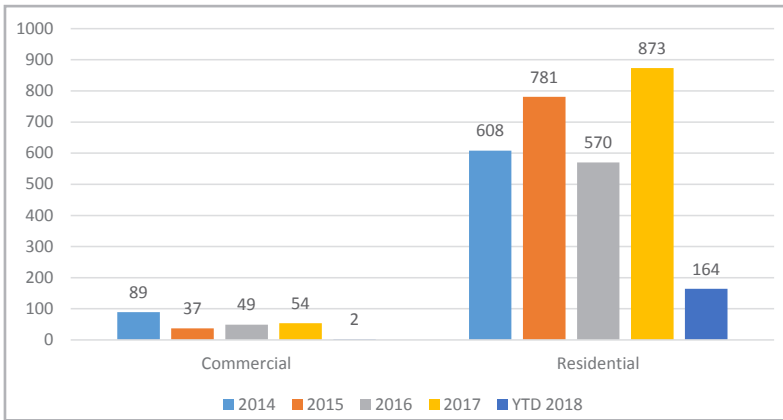

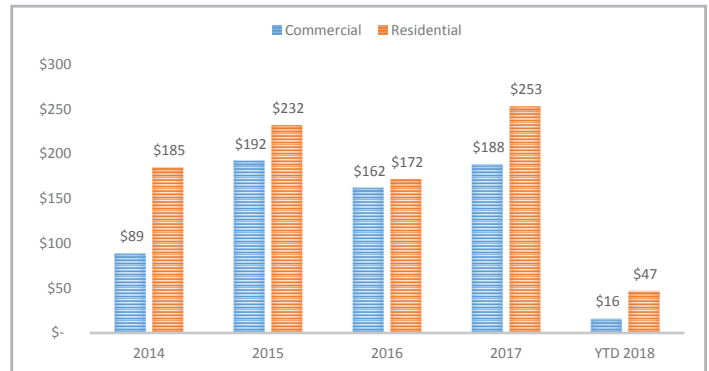

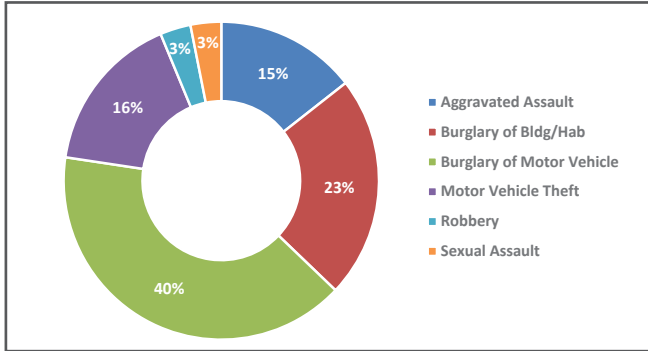

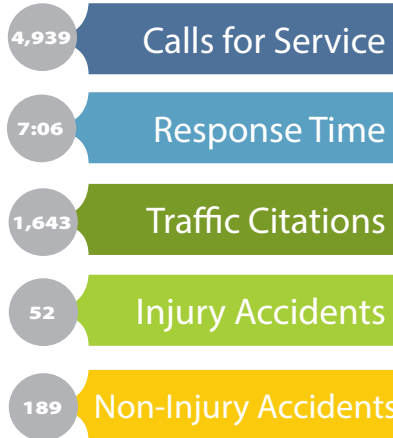

Crime Rates — January 2018



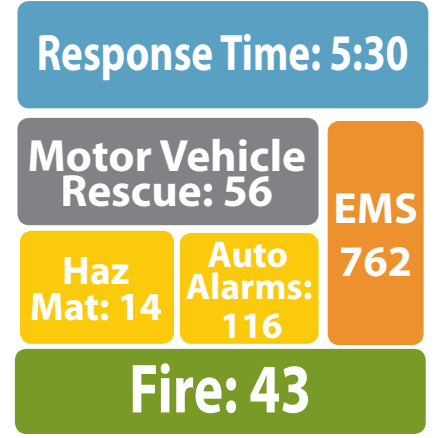
